

Mayor's Clean-up

Volunteers are currently needed at the upcoming Mayor's Clean-up. The Sustainable City Committee is coordinating two Mayor's Clean-up events to help keep Signal Hill clean. Police Department Volunteer Program

The Signal Hill Police Department offers several ways for citizens to volunteer in the community. The Signal Hill Police Department Volunteer Program is a great opportunity for citizens to support and assist the department in a wide variety of tasks and assignments.

It is also a great way to learn and get to know your Police Department. Some of those assignments can include community outreach programs, high visibility patrols, vacation watches, assisting with DUI checkpoints, clerical work, and other assignments that are needed within the department. The Volunteers meet monthly to discuss upcoming events and receive training to better support the Police Department. Explorer Program

The Police Department also offers the Explorer Program. The Signal Hill Police Department Explorer Program is comprised of young men and women between the ages of 14 and 20 years of age. The program is designed to teach young men and women the inner workings of the Police Department which could lead to a career in law enforcement. This program works towards developing leadership skills, learning responsibility through hard work and commitment, and serving the community through dedication. The Explorers assist working side by side with the police officers at community events and as a ride-along during patrol. The Explorers meet on a regular basis to learn law enforcement skills such as laws and how to apply them and radio codes. They also work to maintain their physical fitness through physical training. CERT Training

Signal Hill will be hosting its 6th Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training in September and October this year. The CERT program is fully staffed and funded by the Los Angeles County Fire Department. CERT is a national program providing city residents the opportunity to volunteer to become local disaster responders. Local residents can register to take the training (24 hours offered over three consecutive Saturdays). Residents will learn basic CERT operations, incident command, fire extinguisher use, disaster first aid, disaster psychology as well as participate in a real time disaster response exercise. Signal Hill Welcomes Micro-Breweries and Tasting Rooms



The alcoholic beverage micro-brewery industry is a business and cultural trend that has experienced significant growth across the country in

the past 30 years. California has emerged as a leader in the micro/craft brewery sector. These businesses often include tasting or tap rooms and mobile food services, which gives the otherwise manufacturing

facility a unique social atmosphere. The brewery owners tend to seek out unique locations, either in commercial buildings or in industrial spaces, both new and old. The breweries bring much needed occupancy to otherwise underutilized industrial parks and commercial areas.



Many cities across California have embraced these breweries and tasting rooms, often allowing them as permitted uses outright, or more commonly, with conditional use permits or performance standards to address any nuisance concerns.



The Ten-Mile Brewery (TMB) has received City approval to open their micro-brewery and tasting room at 1136

E. Willow Street. TMB is a family owned and operated brewery. The brewery is named after Ten Mile Creek in the Sierra Nevada where the family owns a cabin.



TMB will have a brewing area, cold storage, and a tasting room. TMB will invite a food truck to be on site evenings and weekends. TMB plans to produce 4 different styles of beer: an

IPA, a pale ale, a lager and a stout. In the first year, TMB plans to produce 500 barrels of beer and reach a capacity of 1,500 barrels.

TMB will also host tours of the plant and sell its beer to bars and restaurants throughout the region. Ten-Mile Brewery is planning to open in April 2017.


Signal Hill Receives Comprehensive Annual Financial Report Award

Signal Hill Library Project Underway



The City is excited to share that the Signal Hill Library project is on its way! March 2018 is the anticipated opening date, and will be here before you know it!

The demolition of the existing Library building will begin on Friday, August 26, 2016 and will be completed by the end of October. During this time, the parking lot serving the Community and Youth Center will be closed to the public. Handicap parking access and regular public parking will be available in the Park's north parking lot only (adjacent to the basketball courts).

Please also be advised that the basketball court located on the east side will be closed through the new construction. Only the west side basketball court on will remain open for play.

Award Corner

Sustainability Awards from the Signal Hill City Council



The Sustainable City Committee nominated and selected the property at 1140 E. Willow Street for a Sustainability Award. Mr. McGuire recently replaced the parking lot turf with mulch and colorful, drought tolerant plants. The building was also renovated with new glass windows and doors, new metal awnings, and new paint color for the exterior walls. At the City Council meeting held on Tuesday, July 12, 2016, Mayor Lori Woods presented the Sustainability Award in the category of Water Efficient Landscapes to the owner of the commercial property.



The Sustainable City Committee also selected a residential home for a Sustainability Award. The home is on Lewis Avenue in the North End neighborhood. The homeowner replaced turf with vibrant, drought tolerant plants.

Beautification Awards from the Signal Hill Planning Commission



The 2nd Quarter Beautification Award was presented to Proscape Landscape at 1446 E. Hill Street. Proscape Landscape replaced turf and designed an aesthetically pleasing yard with decorative rocks, plants, a stream bed and an ornamental bridge pathway. They have replaced the conventional turf irrigation system with drip irrigation and diverted roof, rain gutter and landscape runoff to a new bio-filtration swale stream bed.



As a result of their work, their annual landscape maintenance costs have been reduced by 80-90% and water consumption has been reduced by 75-80%. In addition, they have reduced their carbon footprint by eliminating the need for weekly landscape maintenance which previously included mowing, edging, trimming, blowing and carbon-based fertilization. Proscape is happy to assist the City of Signal Hill and any local homeowners achieve similar results.



The 3rd Quarter Beautification Award was presented to Signal Hill Petroleum Inc., the property owner of 959-999 E. Spring Street for the contemporary design of the building and attractive outdoor dining and landscape.

The building was constructed in 2014 and was the last phase of the development at the Gateway Center. It features contemporary architecture and design such as height variations and tower elements; mix of metal and fabric awnings; and cultured stone veneer on pilaster bases. A spacious outdoor dining area with enhanced paving, planters, and a trellis was also constructed next to the Chipotle restaurant. ■

Animal Care Services



All dogs at least four months old are required to have a current dog license by local municipal codes (SHMC 6.08.010). A permanent dog license tag is issued when a license is first purchased (there is a \$5 fee for replacement tags).

To purchase a dog license, the owner may come to Community Services Department at City Hall with the current rabies inoculation certificate (must be good for the entire licensing period), and a certificate of sterility if the dog has been spayed or neutered. The fees are \$95 unaltered, \$20 altered, \$25 late fee. Seniors (age 60+) have a discounted rate of \$10. This discount is for one altered dog per household only; all others are at regular rates.
