The City of Signal Hill appreciates your attendance. Citizen interest provides the Council and Agency with valuable information regarding issues of the community. Meetings are held on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of every month. In addition, meetings are streamed live on our website at [www.cityofsignalhill.org](http://www.cityofsignalhill.org), and are televised at 7:00 a.m., 2:00 p.m., and 7:00 p.m. every day on Charter Communications Channel 3, and Verizon FiOS Channel 38.

Meetings commence at 6:00 p.m. with the conduct of any business permitted to be conducted in closed session by the Brown Act (Government Code Section 54950, et seq.), if any, and with the public portion of the meeting commencing at 7:00 pm. There is a period for public comment on closed session matters at 6:00 p.m. prior to the closed session. In the event there is no business to be conducted in closed session, the regular meeting shall commence at 7:00 p.m. There is a public comment period at the beginning of the regular meeting, as well as the opportunity to comment on each agenda item as it arises. Any meeting may be adjourned to a time and place stated in the order of adjournment.

The agenda is posted 72 hours prior to each meeting on the City's website and outside of City Hall and available at each meeting. The agenda and related reports are also available for review online and at the City Clerk's office and Library on the Friday afternoon prior to the Council meeting. The purpose of the card is to ensure speakers are correctly identified in the minutes. However, completion of a speaker card is voluntary, and is not a requirement to address the council. (12) PUBLIC HEARINGS

a. Public Hearing - An Appeal of a Notice and Order Dated June 1, 2015 Requiring Removal or Relocation of Items Blocking Garage Access at 2360 E. 19th Street

Summary: The City Council will consider an appeal of a Notice and Order requiring removal or relocation of bulky items blocking garage access at 2360 E. 19th Street. The appeal was submitted by Mr. Hai Hong, the current resident. The property owner of record is Giang L. Hong Company Trust and Hong and Trinh Family Trust.

Recommendation: Waive further reading and adopt the resolution confirming the determinations made in a Notice and Order dated June 1, 2015 requiring removal or relocation of bulky items blocking garage access at 2360 E. 19th Street and authorizing the City Manager to commence abatement in accordance with Signal Hill Municipal Code Section 8.12.110 if the nuisance is not completely abated within fifteen days of service of notice of the City Council's decision.

(13) CITY MANAGER REPORTS

a. Contract Services Agreement - Dog Park Design Services

Summary: Urban Arena was retained to prepare a concept design for the dog park being proposed to be located at 3100 California Avenue. The City Council will consider approval of a contract with Urban Arena to prepare construction plans and specifications for the proposed dog park.

Recommendation: The cost of architectural design services is \$25,970 plus reimbursable expenses of approximately \$5,000. The FY 2015-16 Capital Improvement Program includes \$316,500 for the dog park project. Project costs will be funded with Park Impact Fees paid by developers.

b. Contract Services Agreement for a Water Rate Study with Raftelis Financial Consultants, Incorporated

Summary: At times, the Public Works Department utilizes the services of professional consultants to provide specialized services for the City. Staff is recommending approval of a Contract Services Agreement with Raftelis Financial Consultants, Incorporated, to perform a comprehensive water rate study for the Public Works Department.

Recommendation: Authorize the City Manager to enter into a Contract Services Agreement between the City of Signal Hill and Raftelis Financial Consultants, Incorporated, to perform a Water Rate Study, in a form approved by the City Attorney.

c. Contract Services Agreement Extension with Tetra Tech for Design Services for the Well No. 9 Advanced Water Treatment Plant

Summary: At times, the Public Works Department utilizes the services of professional consultants to provide specialized services for the City. Staff is recommending approval of a Contract Services Agreement extension to provide specialized technical assistance and construction management services during the implementation and construction of the design/build process for the Well No. 9 Advanced Groundwater Treatment Plant.

Recommendation: Authorize the City Manager to execute an amendment to the Contract Services Agreement for professional engineering services with Tetra Tech in a form approved by the City Attorney, increasing the contract sum by \$495,000 and extending the contract term by 12 months.

d. Selection of Date for Interviews Of Applicants for Deputy City Manger

Summary: The City Council will consider dates to conduct interviews of Deputy City Manager candidates.

Recommendation: Staff recommends scheduling a special meeting on Monday, August 3, 2015 or Thursday, August 6, 2015 to conduct the interviews of Deputy City Manager candidates.

Summary: Project Partners is a staff augmentation firm specializing in the interim placement of civil engineering and water operations professionals. Staff is recommending entering into a contract services agreement with Project Partners to provide water operator consultant services to assist in the implementation of water system capital and maintenance projects.

Recommendation: Approve the Contract Services Agreement between the City of Signal Hill and Project Partners for Water Operator Consultant services, subject to the approval as to form by the City Attorney.

b. Schedule of Investments

Summary: The Schedule of Investments is a listing of all surplus funds invested for both the City and the Successor Agency of the former Signal Hill Redevelopment Agency as of the date shown on the report.

Recommendation: Receive and file.

c. Warrant Register Dated July 21, 2015

Summary: The Warrant Register is a listing of all general checks issued since the prior warrant register and warrants to be released upon City Council approval.

Recommendation: Authorize payment of Warrant Register dated July 21, 2015.
