Formal request, again, for Council to immediately amend the CUP for 2901 PCH Self Storage/UHaul Neighborhood Dealer. Please move forward w/public hearings at the next meeting or immediately revoke the permit for noncompliance.

3 months ago Council stated they were recommending amendments to the CUP & moving to public hearings in February. Hearings were cancelled & continue to be delayed without legitimate reason. Community Development waited an additional 3 & a half weeks before notifying the business of proposed CUP amendments & advising them to stop The UHaul truck rental service operating for years against city zoning ordinances. Notification was made February 17. They were given 60 days beginning February 22 to "taper down the UHaul operations". Operations could have ceased within days.

However, the "tapering down of the UHaul" excuse has provided the business an additional 3 months, 2 weeks (& counting) to make repairs to: ceiling/roof to fix leaks/flooding/open holes/exposed wiring as well helping tenants move out of rodent infested units & assist in cleanup of rat feces, urine, water damage & mold in units. The city is knowingly looking the other way & providing excess time to comply.

The business is a **significant safety risk/nuisance to residents** for several years. **Customer reviews reference people living in storage units.**

I request council immediately require PD to respond/document calls for drug activity, intoxicated persons, parking complaints & transients at this location **ethically & honestly**. There's proof they're doing otherwise: logging calls at incorrect addresses, noting incorrect call types/dispositions & delaying response.
