The City of Signal Hill appreciates your attendance. Citizen interest provides the Council and Agency with valuable information regarding issues of the community. Meetings are held on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of every month. In addition, meetings are streamed live on our website at www.cityofsignalhill.org, and are televised at 7:00 a.m., 2:00 p.m., and 7:00 p.m. every day on Charter Communications Channel 3, and Verizon FiOS Channel 38.

Meetings commence at 6:00 p.m. with the conduct of any business permitted to be conducted in closed session by the Brown Act (Government Code Section 54950, et seq.), if any, and with the public portion of the meeting commencing at 7:00 pm. There is a period for public comment on closed session matters at 6:00 p.m. prior to the closed session. In the event there is no business to be conducted in closed session, the regular meeting shall commence at 7:00 p.m. There is a public comment period at the beginning of the regular meeting, as well as the opportunity to comment on each agenda item as it arises. Any meeting may be adjourned to a time and place stated in the order of adjournment.

The agenda is posted 72 hours prior to each meeting on the City's website and outside of City Hall and available at each meeting. The agenda and related reports are also available for review online and at the City Clerk's office and Library on the Friday afternoon prior to the Council meeting. Agenda and staff reports are also available at our website at www.cityofsignalhill.org.

During the meeting, the City Manager presents agenda items for Council consideration. The public is allowed to address the council on all agenda items. The mayor will announce when the period for public comment is open on each agenda item. The public may speak to the council on items that are not listed on the agenda. This public comment period will be held at the beginning of the public portion of the meeting. You are encouraged (but not required) to complete a speaker card prior to the item being considered, and give the card to a City staff member. The purpose of the card is to ensure speakers are correctly identified in the minutes. However, completion of a speaker card is voluntary, and is not a requirement to address the council. - a. Adoption of Ordinance No. 2012-02-1445 Amending Development Standards and Density Requirements for an Affordable Housing Site Located at 1500 E. Hill Street

Summary: Ordinance No. 2012-02-1445 was introduced at a regular meeting of the City Council held on February 21, 2012 and is now presented for second reading and adoption. This ordinance will establish an administrative design review process and clarify the minimum density allowed at the affordable housing site located at 1500 E. Hill Street.

Recommendation: Waive further reading and adopt Ordinance No. 2012-02-1445 approving Zoning Ordinance Amendment 12-01, amending the development standards and density requirements at an approved affordable housing site at 1500 E. Hill Street.

- a. Public Hearing – Approval of a Purchase and Sale Agreement for 3100 California Avenue

Summary: The City staff has been negotiating a purchase and sale agreement for the property located at 3100 California Avenue and Atlantic Avenue. A Summary Report pursuant to California Health and Safety Code, Section 33433 has been completed for this project.

Recommendation: In accordance with State of California Health and Safety Code Sections 33431 and 33433, Public Notice was provided of the Public Hearing in the Signal Tribune on February 10 and 17, 2012. Staff is requesting that the Public Hearing be continued until April 3, 2012 to allow additional time for the purchase and sale agreement to be drafted and reviewed.

b. Public Hearing – Approval of a Purchase and Sale Agreement for 630-798 E. Spring Street, 800-998 E. Spring Street, 631-799 E. Canton Street, 801-999 E. Canton Street, 630-798 E. Canton Street, 800-998 E. Canton Street, 631-799 E. 29th Street And 801-999 E. 29th Street

Summary: The City staff has been negotiating a purchase and sale agreement for the property located on Spring Street, between California Avenue and Atlantic Avenue to 29th Street. A Summary Report pursuant to California Health and Safety Code, Section 33433 has been completed for this project.

Recommendation: In accordance with State of California Health and Safety Code Sections 33431 and 33433, Public Notice was provided of the Public Hearing in the Signal Tribune on February 10 and 17, 2012. Staff is requesting that the Public Hearing be continued until April 3, 2012 to allow additional time for the purchase and sale agreement to be drafted and reviewed.

c. Public Hearing – Resolution Consenting to the Assignment of Pipelines from Chevron Pipeline Company to Crimson California Pipeline, L.P.

Summary: In 2010, Chevron Pipeline Company (CPL) and Crimson California Pipeline, L.P (Crimson) entered into an Asset Purchase and Sale Agreement pursuant to which CPL transferred a portion of its pipeline system to Crimson. The transfer was approved by the California Public Utilities Commission on December 2, 2010. CPL and Crimson finalized their transaction on February 16, 2011. This resolution consents to the assignment of pipelines from Chevron to Crimson.

Recommendation: Waive further reading and adopt the resolution consenting to the assignment of certain pipeline from Chevron Pipeline Company to Crimson California Pipeline, L.P., and to lay and use pipes and appurtenances for transmitting and distributing oil and petroleum products for any and all lawful purposes under and along the public streets, ways, alleys, and places as the same now or may hereafter exist, within said City.

d. Public Hearing – Annual Review of the 2012 Institutional Permits

Summary: Signal Hill Municipal Code, Chapter 8.16 requires an annual review of institutional permits by the City Council. The Courtyard Care Center, located at 1880 Dawson Avenue and the Las Brisas Child Care Center, located at 2399 California Avenue have submitted applications to obtain their permit for the calendar year 2012.

Recommendation: Waive further reading and adopt the resolution approving the annual institutional permit for the Courtyard Care Center and the Las Brisas Child Care Center.

Summary: Each year at the first meeting in April the City Council appoints delegates and alternates to various governmental agency boards on which the City Council has representation. This report addresses City Council appointments to governmental agency boards that provide a stipend.

Summary: On February 27, 2012, the City received bids for the Energy Efficient Pump Motors Project, No. 621. Staff is recommending an award of contract to the lowest responsible bidder, Weber Water Resources.

Recommendations: 1. Authorize the City Manager to award a contract for the Energy Efficient Pump Motors Project, No. 621, in a form approved by the City Council, to Weber Water Resources in the amount of \$63,040. 2. Approve an appropriation of \$5,400 from the Water Fund balance.

b. Resolution Declaring Final Acceptance of the ADA Improvements at Orange Avenue and Willow Street Project, No. 798

Summary: Golden State Constructors, Inc. has completed the ADA Improvements at Orange Avenue and Willow Street Project, No. 798, in conformance with the plans and specifications to the satisfaction of the Public Works Department. Staff is recommending final acceptance of the work performed by Golden State Constructors, Inc.

Recommendation: Waive further reading and adopt the resolution declaring work to be completed in conformance with the plans and specifications for the ADA Improvements at Orange Avenue and Willow Street Project, No. 798, in the City of Signal Hill, in accordance with the contract entered into between Golden State Constructors, Inc. and the City of Signal Hill.

c. Resolution Designating a Handicapped Parking Space Adjacent to 1901 Raymond Avenue

Summary: This resolution will designate a handicapped parking space adjacent to 1901 Raymond Avenue

Recommendation: Waive further reading and adopt the resolution designating a handicapped parking space adjacent to 1901 Raymond Avenue for the exclusive use of disabled persons.
