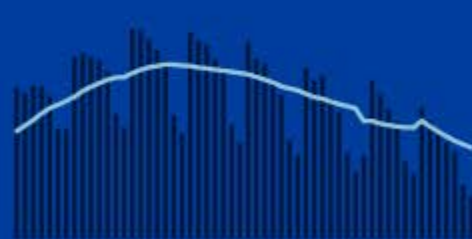

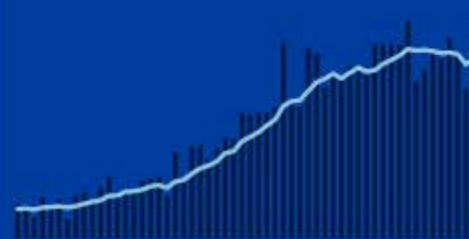

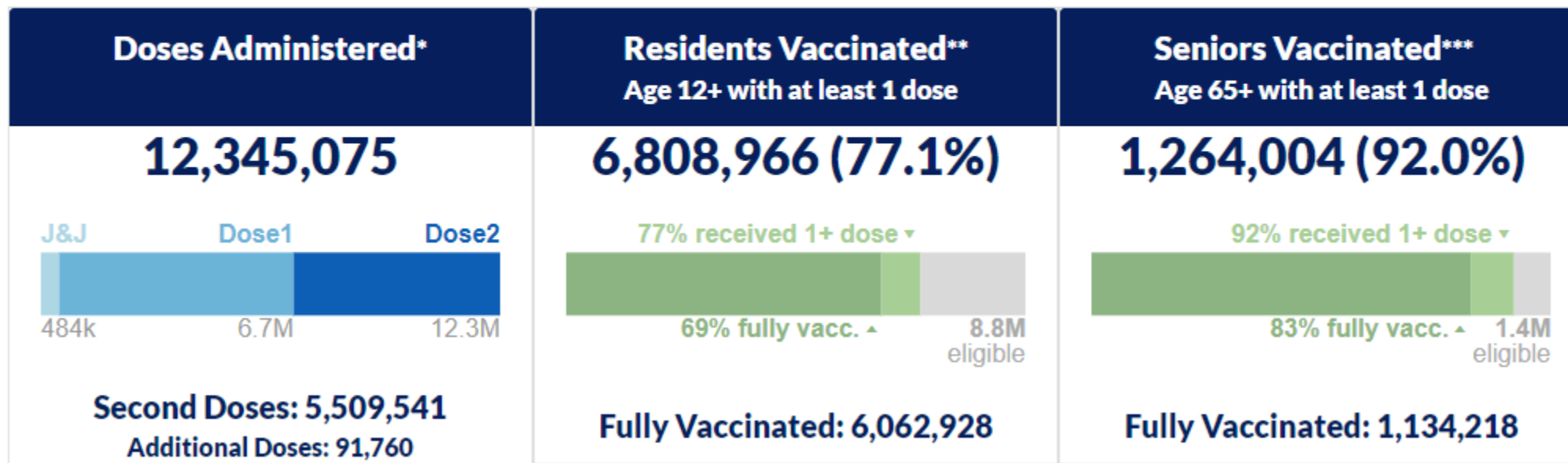

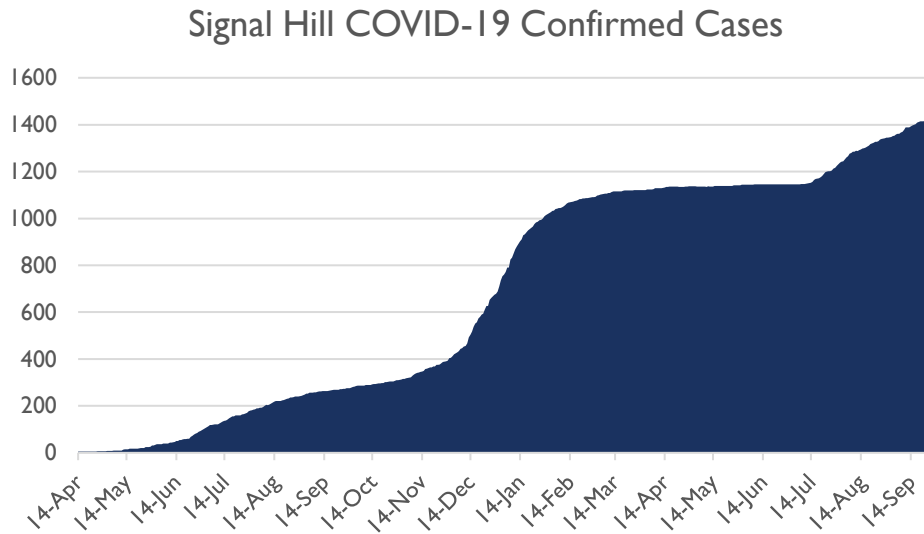

PFIZER BOOSTER DOSES

- Following the CDC's endorsement, eligible LA County residents can begin receiving their Pfizer booster doses
 - The following groups of people who received the second of the two-dose Pfizer vaccine series at least 6 months ago and are either:
 - 65 years or older
 - Residents of long-term care facilities
 - Ages 18-64 with underlying medical conditions
 - Ages 18-64 with high institutional/occupational risk, including healthcare workers, first responders, teachers, day care staff, grocery workers, workers in homeless shelters, and workers in prisons
 - Make an appointment online by using the [MyTurn.CA.GOV](https://myturn.ca.gov) system or call 833-540-0473.
 - Boosters for Moderna and Johnson & Johnson are dependent upon FDA review.



LACDPH GUIDANCE FOR HALLOWEEN EVENTS

- In general, outdoor Halloween activities where there is ample space and ventilation, such as outdoor costume parties, pumpkin patch visits, outdoor ghost tours, or hayrides are safer than crowded indoor events such as haunted houses tours, indoor costume parties, or spooky indoor performances.
- Trick-or-treating
 - Set up trick-or-treat events outside.
 - Use commercially packaged non-perishable treats.
 - Set up a station with individually packaged treats so trick-or-treaters can grab and go.
 - If you're giving out treats, wear a face mask, even if outside.

LACDPH GUIDANCE FOR LARGE EVENTS

- What's a mega event?
 - Mega events include indoor events with more than 1,000 attendees and outdoor events with more than 10,000 attendees. Examples include conventions, conferences, expos, concerts, shows, sporting events, live entertainment, fairs, festivals, parades, theme parks, amusement parks, water parks, marathons and car shows.
- What are the requirements?
 - All attendees at indoor mega events must show proof of full vaccination or a diagnostic test result, taken within 72 hours prior to entry.
 - Beginning October 7, all attendees ages 12 and over at outdoor mega events must show proof of full vaccination or a diagnostic test result, taken within 72 hours prior to entry.
 - Attendees can no longer self-attest to prove vaccination status or a negative test result.

Indoor Mega Event Requirements

Beginning on September 20, all attendees at Indoor Mega Events involving 1,000 or more persons must, prior to entry, show verification of COVID-19 vaccination status or a negative test result.

LACDPH GUIDANCE FOR NIGHTCLUBS, LOUNGES, BARS, BREWERIES, WINERIES AND DISTILLERIES

- What are the new requirements in the Health Officer Order and when do they go into effect?
 - Effective October 7, all allowed patrons must provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination status with a photo ID for entry.
 - Between October 7 and November 3, all allowed patrons must provide proof they received at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccination for entry to obtain indoor services.
 - Beginning November 4, all allowed patrons must provide proof of full vaccination for entry into the facility for indoor services.
 - Additionally, by November 4, all on-site employees must provide their employer with proof of full vaccination.



LACDPH GUIDANCE FOR NIGHTCLUBS, LOUNGES, BARS, BREWERIES, WINERIES AND DISTILLERIES

- Can unvaccinated or partially vaccinated patrons show a negative test result taken within 72 hours for entry to the facility for indoor service?
 - No. A negative test result does not qualify as an alternative to providing proof of vaccination.



LACDPH GUIDANCE FOR NIGHTCLUBS, LOUNGES, BARS, BREWERIES, WINERIES AND DISTILLERIES

- For what areas of the facility will patrons need to be screened for vaccination status?
 - Patrons seated, receiving services, or participating in activities within the indoor portions of the business must be screened and show proof of their vaccination status. Patrons may receive services or participate in activities in the outdoor portions of the business without being screened for vaccination status.
 - Individuals that do not show proof of vaccination may for limited circumstances be permitted to enter the indoor portions of the business while wearing a well-fitted mask:
 - As part of their employment to make a delivery or pick up, provide a service or repair, or for emergency or regulatory purposes;
 - To get to the outdoor portion of the facility or to use the restroom; or
 - To order, pick up, or pay for food or drink “to go”. Patrons must wait outside for their order to be ready for pick-up.

- Will a bar be required to verify vaccination for indoor patrons if there is food served?
 - Yes. Any facility that operates primarily as a bar will be required to verify vaccination status. This includes bars that may serve snacks on site but do not operate as full-service, sit-down restaurants. Other evening entertainment facilities that serve alcohol, such as karaoke bars, are also required to comply.
- How will employees know what is an acceptable form of vaccination record? What training resources are available from the County?
 - Employers and employees may refer to the LACDPH website for more information. At this time, a guide can be found under “Verifying Proof of COVID-19 Vaccination.”



LACDPH GUIDANCE FOR NIGHTCLUBS, LOUNGES, BARS, BREWERIES, WINERIES AND DISTILLERIES

- Will employees need to keep a patron's record of vaccine status or a record of the verification process?
 - No. By allowing a patron to be seated, receive services, or participate in activities indoors at the facility, the facility owner/management is attesting that the facility has appropriately verified each indoor patron's vaccination status prior to entry. The business will be subject to any penalties for noncompliance if it is found that it did not adhere to the proper verification process.
- What will happen if a facility is found not verifying vaccination status?
 - County health inspectors will be visiting and observing the operations of facilities. An initial violation will be documented on an inspection report. A second violation will result in an administrative citation in the amount of \$500.



LACDPH GUIDANCE FOR NIGHTCLUBS, LOUNGES, BARS, BREWERIES, WINERIES AND DISTILLERIES

- Is vaccination verification required for private parties?
 - Yes. Vaccination verification applies to all indoor private parties that are held in any of these facilities.
- Are masks still required indoors after vaccine verification?
 - Yes. Masks are still required indoors even if vaccinated. Masks may be removed while actively eating and drinking. Patrons must be seated or positioned at a stationary place while actively eating or drinking.
- For customers whose vaccination status has been verified previously, are we required to repeatedly check?
 - Yes. Vaccination status must be verified each time a patron enters.

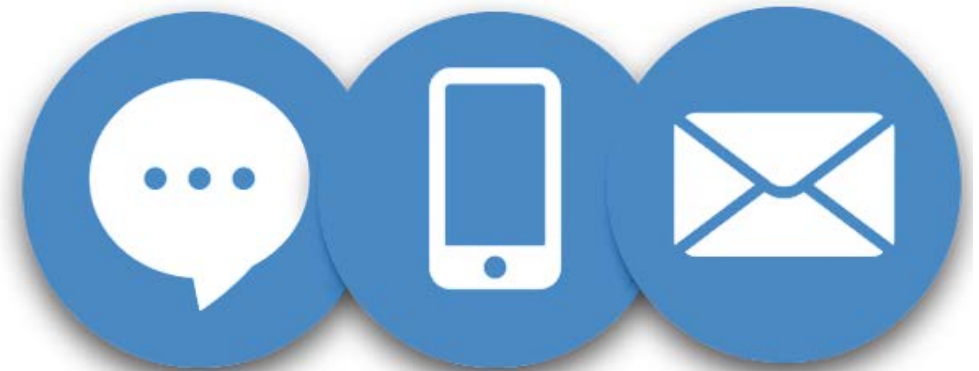
- Will a full-service restaurant with a connected bar be required to verify vaccination status for patrons for indoor access?
 - It is a strong recommendation for restaurants to implement vaccination verification; however, it is not required, even those that have a bar as part of the restaurant.
- Will restaurants that are mostly family entertainment centers be required to verify vaccination for indoor patrons?
 - Not if the facility is permitted as a full-service restaurant. Patrons are expected to be masked at all times.
- City of Long Beach guidelines are in alignment with LACDPH guidelines.
