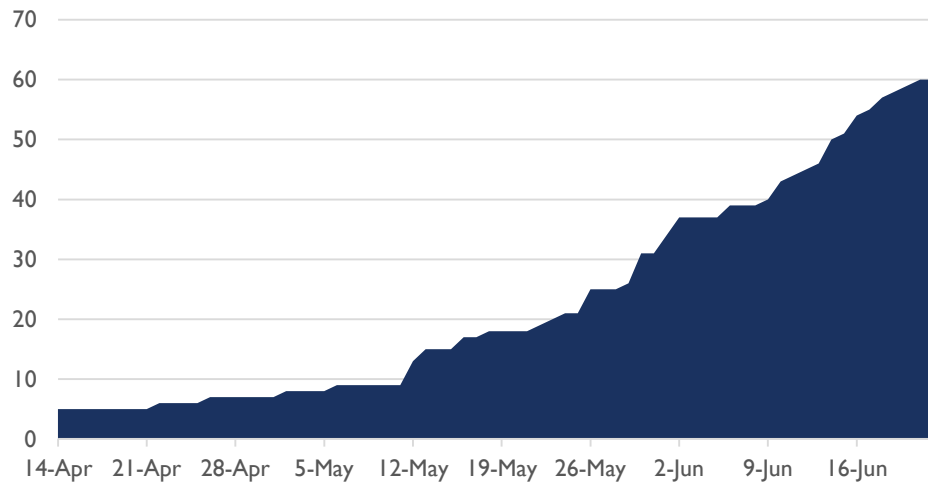

Signal Hill COVID-19 Confirmed Cases

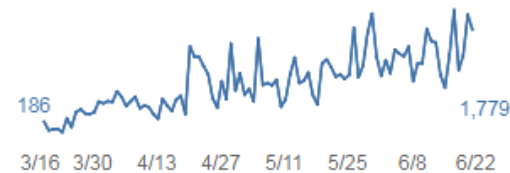

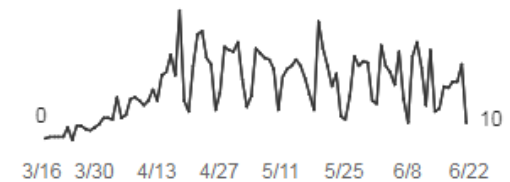

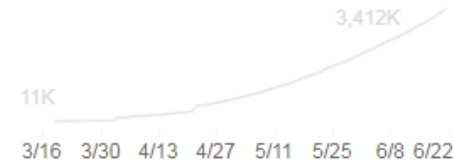

Lab Tests Reported Statewide

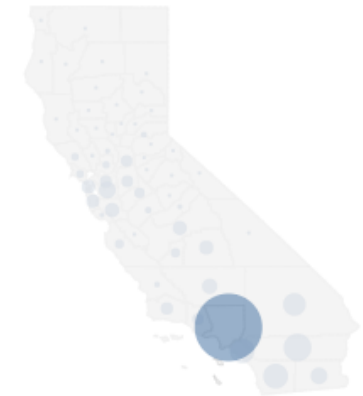

# ROADMAP TO RECOVERY

- Face coverings should be worn

# ROADMAP TO RECOVERY – BUSINESSES

- LA COVID-19 Recovery Fund ([dcba.lacounty.gov](http://dcba.lacounty.gov))
  - For small businesses and nonprofits, \$3,200,000 grant fund
  - Low cost working capital loans (\$15,000) to maintain small businesses who may not qualify for federal disaster assistance
  - Low cost working capital loans (\$15,000) to nonprofit organizations and small businesses who are providing essential services, or transitioning to provide essential services, that directly address the health or economic impacts of COVID-19
  - Cash grants (\$5,000) to micro entrepreneurs and other highly vulnerable populations who do not qualify for federal disaster relief
  - Round I application period is June 29 – July 3, 2020 with funding awarded late July

- City Hall
  - Will reopen to the public by appointment only beginning Monday, July 6, 2020
  - Visitors will be required to wear a mask and answer a COVID-19 questionnaire
  - Physical distancing requirements inside City Hall

# CONTINUING TO SERVE THE COMMUNITY

- Modified summer camp for Signal Hill residents and City employees
  - Due to COVID-19 restrictions space is extremely limited
- Campers ages 3-5, 6-9, and 10-12
- Hours 8:30 am – 5:30 pm
- Cost \$60 per week (scholarships available – thank you SHCF!)
- Three sessions
  - Session 1 July 6 - July 24 (3 weeks) Cost: \$60 Deposit: \$30
  - Session 2 July 27 - August 14 (3 weeks) Cost: \$180 Deposit: \$50
  - Session 3 August 17 - August 21 (1 week) Cost: \$180 Deposit: \$50
- In person registration only at the Signal Hill Youth Center on Friday, June 26 7:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m.
  - Exact cash or checks preferred

Two proofs of Signal Hill residency are required at registration:

- Current Driver's License
- Current Utility Bill
- Current Rental Agreement
- Any other current government-issued document
