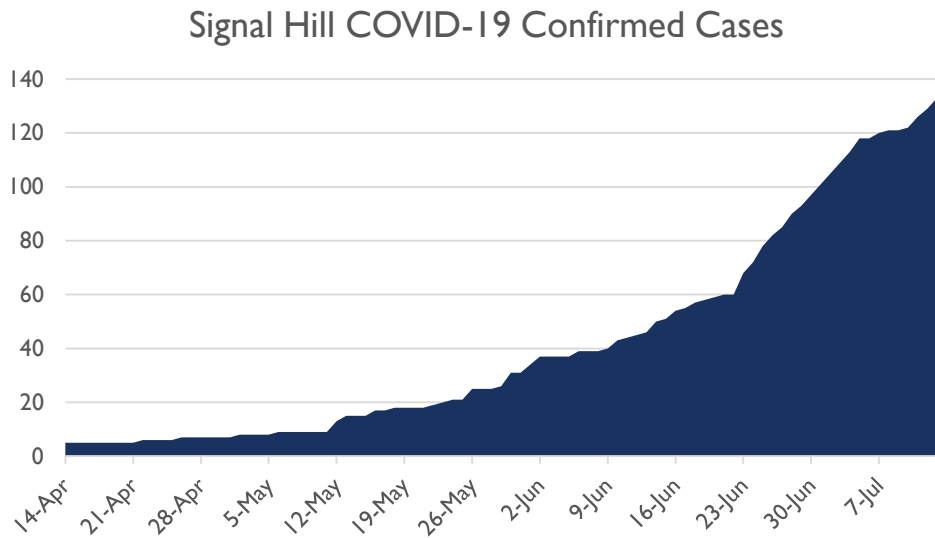

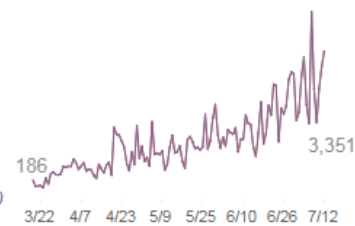

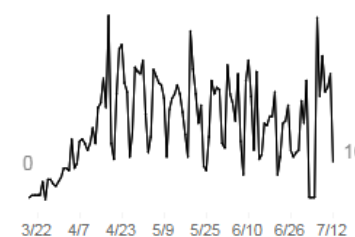

(Target: the 3-day average number of hospitalized patients has not increased over the past 14 days.)

(Target: past 3-day average number of available ICU beds has not decreased over the past 14 days AND accounts for at least 10% of total ICU bed capacity)

## Daily number of available ventilators, past 3-day average

# ROADMAP TO RECOVERY – REVISED HEALTH ORDER

- On July 13, 2020, the LA County Health Officer Order was modified to align with Governor Newsom’s latest directives
- The Order requires the closure of certain indoor operations which promote mixing of known cohorts and make adherence to physical distancing with face coverings difficult
  - All events and gatherings
  - Bars and indoor dining at restaurants
  - Gyms and Fitness Centers
  - Places of Worship (indoor operations)
  - Indoor Protests
  - Offices for non-critical infrastructure sectors
  - Indoor museums, zoos, and aquariums
  - Cardrooms and satellite wagering facilities
  - Personal care services (nail salons, massage parlors, and tattoo parlors)
  - Hair salons and barbershops
  - Malls

# ROADMAP TO RECOVERY

## + WASH YOUR HANDS

Wash your hands with soap and warm water regularly.



## + COVER A COUGH OR SNEEZE

Cover your cough or sneeze with your sleeve, or tissue. Dispose of tissue and wash your hands afterward.



## + DON'T TOUCH

Avoid touching eyes, nose or mouth, especially with unwashed hands.



## + KEEP YOUR DISTANCE

Avoid close contact with people who are sick.



## + STAY HOME

If you experience respiratory symptoms like a cough or fever, stay home.



## + GET HELP

If you experience symptoms of COVID-19 (cough, fever, shortness of breath), call your health care provider or local health department before seeking care.

# ROADMAP TO RECOVERY – STILL OPEN

- Restaurants for outdoor dining, pickup, delivery, and drive-thru service
- Retail sales only at breweries and tasting rooms
- Car dealership showrooms and sales
- Retailers that do not sell essential good and are not located inside a mall (at 50% capacity)
- Day Camps
- Trails and parks
- Beaches and bike paths
- Golf courses, tennis courts, outdoor shooting and archery ranges, equestrian centers, and community gardens
- Campgrounds and RV Parks
- Hotels, lodging, and short-term rentals for tourism and individual travel
- Swap meets
- Drive-in movie theaters

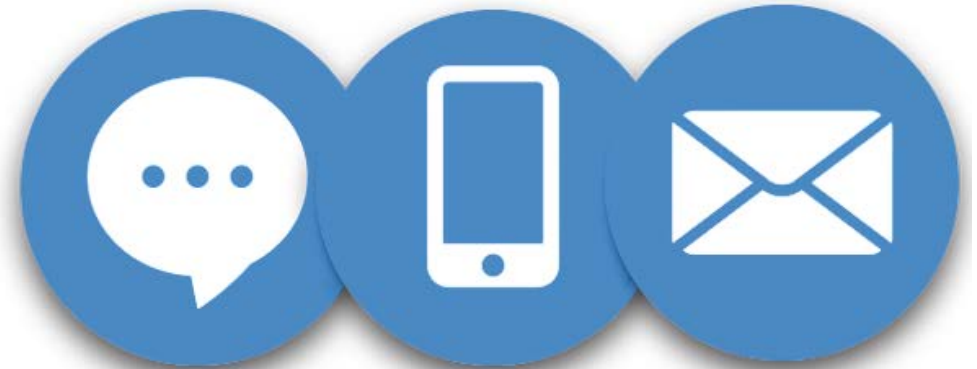
